The following is a summary of the actions taken at the October 6, 2020 meeting. A copy of the proceedings can be obtained by contacting the District Manager.

FIRST ORDER OF BUSINESS Roll Call

Mr. Oliver called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. and called the roll.

SECOND ORDER OF BUSINESS Audience Comments

There being none, the next item followed.

THIRD ORDER OF BUSINESS Approval of the Minutes of the September 1, 2020 Meeting

On MOTION by Mr. Payton seconded by Mr. Krueger with all in favor the minutes of the September 1, 2020 meeting were approved as presented.

FOURTH ORDER OF BUSINESS Update Regarding Open Items

A. State Attorney Investigation Regarding Fire Destruction of Trailer with Stored Pine Straw

Mr. Hahn stated two arrests were made and two court dates scheduled for October. Once the hearings are held all the information will be released and we should have the official information from the state attorneys' office. The state attorneys' office will also work with us on any restitution, we told them the dollar amounts. In November it should be over, and we can take action on the individuals involved as far as suspension of privileges.

B. Sidewalk Repairs/Completion

Mr. Biagetti stated at the last meeting we had gotten all the communication boxes moved and I submitted a quote to the HOA board to see if they would like to pay for the sidewalk repair. There was one of our resident members on the board who knew someone at Vintage Estate Homes and he restarted that communication with them. Hopefully, by the end of next week we will have that section poured at no cost to the HOA or the CDD.

C. Additional Streetlights

Mr. Biagetti stated we have talked about potentially adding three streetlights on Eagle Landing Parkway across from the Oakmont neighborhood. We originally received a quote from Clay Electric to install three lights at \$13,198. We finally received a quote from T&M Electric to see if he can bring the cost down by doing part of the work then Clay Electric does the final installation. That unfortunately increased the amount and came in at \$7,000 and Clay Electric's portion was \$9,000. If we would like to move forward with this project our best option is to stick with the original quote from Clay Electric of \$13,198.

Mr. Payton moved to authorize staff to contract with Clay Electric for the three streetlights at a cost of \$13,198 and there being no second, the motion died for lack of a second.

D. Consideration of Proposals to Construct Replacement Weir

Mr. Payton stated at the last meeting we decided to talk to another engineering firm. I met with the gentleman from ETM, who is also an Eagle Landing resident, and the suggestion was that we change the type of storm structure from the damaged structure to a box type. Keith sent out

the new plans based on that conversation and it will be similar to what we have in the other lakes and also fill in the berm. Keith informed me last week that the plans had been sent to the state for approval and he hopes by the next meeting we will have something to approve.

E. Amendment to Purchase & Sale Agreement

F. Funding Contribution Agreement with Eagle Landing at Oakleaf Plantation Homeowners Association

Ms. Buchanan stated I would like to discuss item E and F at the same time. As you will recall at the last board meeting, we discussed a request from the HOA to allow the HOA to deposit \$200,000 with the district in lieu of depositing it directly with the developer. No one had an objection to that so the next two documents would put that in place. The first is an amendment to the purchase and sale agreement. As you will see it would increase the price by \$200,000 to \$638,000 and adds the \$200,000 to the initial payment that we had contemplated would be \$300,000 and change the conditions precedent to closing to instead of having it deposited with the developer it would be deposited with the CDD. It has not been circulated to the developer yet but conceptually I think it accomplishes what we discussed last month.

The funding agreement was prepared by the HOA's attorney and it details the transfer of the \$200,000 from the HOA to the CDD. The one thing I will note is that in paragraph 5 it requires the transfer of funds prior to February 28, 2021 and I suggest we move that out a month because we don't anticipate closing in February. We anticipate closing in March.

It is the same conditions we discussed last month that we would agree to accept the \$200,000 but we would agree that in exchange for that funding we would only use the property in accordance with Chapter 190 and if we sell the property and there is a profit we split it proportionately.

These two documents together allow for the HOA to contribute funds directly to the CDD and we have updated our purchase and sale agreement terms to accommodate the transaction.

On MOTION by Mr. Randy Smith seconded by Mr. Rick Smith with four in favor and Mr. Payton voting no, the amendment to the purchase and sale agreement and the funding contribution agreement with Eagle Landing at Oakleaf Plantation Homeowners Association were approved in substantial form.

G. Cost Share Agreement with Armstrong CDD

Ms. Buchanan stated Matt was successful in getting a price proposal from the vendor that identifies how much money the portion of the pond in Armstrong CDD is going to cost and it is approximately \$175 per month. We went back and forth a little bit with the vendor to try to understand how he came to that calculation and ultimately it is an analysis of the linear footage of the two ponds. I have spoken with the developer at Greyhawk about this cost and he is completely comfortable with paying the \$175. I proposed that he pay it on an annual basis rather than Jim having to submit a funding request every month. At this point we are wrapping up the written agreement and we will execute it between meetings.

Mr. Oliver stated I think we have approval on this already.

Ms. Buchanan stated correct.

FIFTH ORDER OF BUSINESS Update Regarding Phase 6 Construction Matters

A. Update Regarding West Bank Construction

Mr. Vincent stated in one small cul-de-sac we are doing a slight redesign on the drainage; 100% of the work is done other than striping and signage. We are in the process of going through a series of punch list items from CCUA and the county and expect that to be done by the end of the week. We did a walk through on Monday and we will have a follow-up walk through at the end of this week. I'm working on the closeout documents now and within the next week we will be ready to get the county to take it to the board of county commissioners for acceptance with the exception of signs. Matt and I have worked together and have 41 signposts pulled out in the existing sections, had them painted and I picked them up today and they all look good. When we are done switching out Tynes Boulevard section 1 and doing section 2 there will be 10 remaining for you to put the squeeze on Dream Finders.

In terms of the lake park, Baker is done and in terms of the restroom building, the rough work is done and the water meter and reuse meter are set and we are trying to get the pressure test from the plumber. We are going to get a change order for the increase in lumber and we will have a change order to offset that lumber increase. The way the funding is structured I'm paying 100% of the change order. Tree Amigos told me they would be done with all the irrigation on the dog park and ballfield area and it appears they are, but it appears that the rain from Sunday and Monday

has slowed them down a bit. The sod is supposed to go down this week. The playground equipment is in and will be ready for installation the first week of November.

B. Consideration of Series 2019 Requisitions (77-79)

On MOTION by Mr. Payton seconded by Mr. Krueger with all in favor requisitions 77-79 from the 2019 construction account were approved.

SIXTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Honours Golf Performance/Bonus Plan

A. FY 20 Evaluation Results

Mr. Oliver stated we received all supervisor submitted rankings after the end of the fiscal year. I circulated those results late yesterday showing the total rankings of each of the five supervisors. It resulted in a final score of 4.006 on a scale of 1-5. Based on the criteria set forth at the beginning of the fiscal year, a bonus amount of \$15,120 is to be awarded.

B. Discussion of FY 21 Evaluation Metrics

Mr. Oliver asked are there any suggested revisions to the evaluation criteria for FY 21?

The following suggestions were made some of the items need to be better defined such as clubhouse amenities; better descriptions or definitions; determination of what one through five mean for consistency; would help. We need to determine as a board what one through five mean for consistency to provide more clarity in each area of ranking; breakout of tennis and swim centers and breakout by functional areas for staff interaction ranking

SEVENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS Consideration of Proposal from The Lake Doctors for Fiscal Year 2021

Mr. Biagetti stated Lake Doctors put this proposal together for the new ponds that we are adding into the current agreement in Phase 5B and Phase 6. We discussed the cost share agreement and in total we are looking at an increase of \$650 minus the \$175 from Armstrong so we are looking at a net \$477 increase.

On MOTION by Mr. Hermening seconded by Mr. Payton with all in favor the proposal from Lake Doctors in the amount of \$2,862 monthly for fiscal year 2021 was approved.

EIGHTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of Audit Engagement Letter from Berger Toombs Elam Gaines & Frank

Mr. Oliver stated Berger Toombs is the CPA firm selected through the RFP process. The budgeted amount of \$7,000 the same as the proposal cost.

On MOTION by Mr. Krueger seconded by Mr. Payton with all in favor the engagement letter with Berger Toombs to perform the fiscal year 2020 audit was approved.

NINTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Staff Reports

A. General Manager - Report

A copy of the operations report was included as part of the agenda package and included the operations of the amenity center, athletic center, tennis facility, golf and clubhouse operations, common areas and retention ponds and landscaping.

B. District Counsel

There being none, the next item followed.

C. District Manager

Mr. Oliver stated our next meeting is scheduled for November 3rd, election night and it may make sense to move that to another night.

Mr. Payton stated I suggest we move it to the week after.

The following items were discussed: Guests access to facilities and capacity levels for rentals and events, suggestion that a fitness instructor be employed so that group classes are free

to the residents to include tennis, but a personal trainer would be fee based, proposed improvements to clubhouse smoking area to reduce impact on the adjacent no-smoking area, golf course improvement, security patrol service, new menu items, possible adjustment to cabana bar season & hours, actions related to kids trespassing on golf course, future installation of aerators to reduce algae growth in lake, reduce negative impact on irrigation system, new beverage cart after December, security cameras, prioritize capital projects with projected start dates quarterly, pocket park in 5B installation of trees to block access by golf carts, washout behind hole #18, concrete cart staging area with cart path, engineering services, community yard sale, additional message board, make the website more user friendly.

On MOTION by Mr. Hermening seconded by Mr. Payton staff was authorized to issue an RFQ for engineering services.

A resident asked is there a maintenance issue on the golf course equipment?

Mr. Hahn responded I will work with our mechanic. Hydraulic leaks happen but I don't think it is on the maintenance side. I will have him check all the hoses again.

1.0 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 Findings

AE&E has performed a Phase I Environmental Site Assessment in conformance with the scope and limitations of ASTM Practice E 1527-13 of the Eagle Landing Parkway Parcel, Orange Park, Clay County, FL 32065, the property. Any exceptions to, or deletions from, this practice are described in Sections 2.3 and 2.4 of this report. This assessment has revealed the following findings.

On-Site Findings:

None.

Off-Site Findings:

- ➤ The adjoining properties to the north, east and west are active golf courses (Eagle Landing Golf Course). The course and structures were built in 2005/2006 and the historic usage of DDT, organochlorine pesticides and metals based products (i.e. arsenic) were phased out beginning in the late 1970's and 1980's. Therefore, the adjoining golf courses appear to pose a low threat to the subject property soil/groundwater.
- ➤ AE&E reviewed the FDEP Contamination Locator Mapping Database for information regarding documented Brownfields, petroleum, Superfund and other Waste Cleanup sites within a ½ mile radius of the subject property. Zero (0) listed contaminated sites were identified within a ½ mile radius of the subject property.



1.2 Conclusions

<u>Recognized Environmental Conditions (RECs)</u> — This assessment has revealed no evidence of unresolved recognized environmental conditions in connection with the subject site.

<u>Historical Recognized Environmental Conditions (HREC's)</u> — This assessment has revealed no evidence of HREC's in connection with the subject site.

<u>Controlled Recognized Environmental Conditions (CREC's)</u> — This assessment has revealed no evidence of CREC's in connection with the subject site.

1.3 Recommendations

Based on our findings and conclusions, additional assessment does not appear warranted at this time.

2.0 SUBJECT PROPERTY & VICINITY DESCRIPTION

The subject property consists of a portion of one parcel with the following Parcel ID N° 13-04-24-005542-010-00, in Orange Park, Clay County, Florida 32065. According to the Clay County Property Appraiser, the current owner of the subject property is Eagle Landing LP. The property use is listed as a conservation easement (9605). The parcel consists of approximately 7.99 acres. Information obtained during our subject property inspection on October 19, 2020, confirmed that the site is currently undeveloped wooded land and a lake. A copy of the Clay County Property Appraiser's Card is included in Appendix A. Figure 1 is the Site Location Map. The brief legal description listed on the Clay County Property Appraiser's Card is as follows:

3.0 USER PROVIDED INFORMATION

3.1 Title Records

Title record information (chain of title) associated with the subject property was not provided to AE&E by the client.

3.2 Environmental Liens and Activity and Use Limitations (AULs)

Information regarding environmental liens or activity and use limitations in connection with the subject property was not provided to AE&E by the client.



3.3 Specialized Knowledge, Commonly Known or Reasonably Ascertainable Information

The client provided no specialized knowledge, commonly known or reasonably ascertainable information that is material to recognized environmental conditions in connection with the subject property. AE&E was not provided with or made aware of previous environmental assessments or other documentation that is material to recognized environmental conditions in connection with the subject property.

3.4 Valuation Reduction for Environmental Issues

The client nor owner provided information regarding valuation reduction for environmental issues in connection with the subject property (fair market value - potential purchase), except that information provided in Section 3.5.

3.5 User Questionnaire

Information regarding the questions in the User Questionnaire was provided by Mr. Jason E. Merritt, Attorney for South Village Community Development District. Mr. Merritt had no knowledge of any environmental cleanup liens, activity and land use limitations, valuation reduction due to contamination or direct information regarding any historic spills, releases or cleanups. The User Questionnaire is attached in Appendix H.

4.0 STANDARD ENVIRONMENTAL RECORDS

4.1 Environmental Database Search

AE&E utilized the services of Environmental Data Resources, Inc (EDR) for the requisite regulatory database review portion of the Phase I ESA. EDR relies upon data from Federal, State and local government sources, which occasionally have been found to be either incorrect or incomplete. Data processing of federal and state database files is primarily done utilizing point-geocoding (latitude and longitude) methodology of environmental sites that fall within the commensurate ASTM Standard E 1527-13 minimum search distance (MSD) parameter. Neither EDR nor AE&E can warranty the accuracy or reliability of the information included within the EDR database report, which AE&E relied upon in developing opinions regarding environmental risk. In addition to the requisite federal and state regulatory database files, which are detailed below, EDR also provides information from the review of additional federal and state non-ASTM databases. This information is detailed in the EDR database report found in the Appendices section of this report.

Some data processing of federal and state database files is also done utilizing unique geographic criteria (zip codes, county, etc.). This methodology is less precise than the point-geocoding methodology. As a result, due to poor or inadequate address information, several environmental sites that fall within the subject site zip code or county are listed as "Orphan Sites" if the point-geocoding data processing method could not be utilized. Review of the Orphan Sites List within the EDR Database Report revealed zero (0) "Orphan Sites". Please note, ASTM Standard E 1527-13 states the "user" or "environmental professional" are not obligated to identify mistakes or insufficiencies in information provided to them. AE&E does attempt to identify environmentally sensitive property uses, which may have a significant potential to impair the subject property.

Review of the database report revealed that zero (0) listed database site was identified within the search radii. The following list provides a summary of the findings of the environmental database report.

AE&E reviewed the FDEP Contamination Locator Mapping Database for information regarding documented Brownfields, petroleum, Superfund and other Waste Cleanup sites within a ½ mile radius of the subject property. Zero (0) listed contaminated sites were identified within a ½ mile radius of the subject property. A copy of the FDEP Contamination Locator Map for the area is attached in Appendix I.

4.4 FDEP Institutional Controls Registry

AE&E reviewed the FDEP Institutional Controls Registry for information regarding deed restrictions and/or institutional/engineering controls. The FDEP Institutional Controls Registry includes results from a search of available land title records for environmental cleanup liens and other activity and use limitations, such as engineering controls and institutional controls. A review of the FDEP Institutional Controls Registry revealed no deed restrictions and/or institutional/engineering controls were found for the subject property or vicinity properties within a ½ mile radius of the subject property. A copy of the FDEP Institutional Controls Registry map for the area is attached as Appendix H.

4.5 Environmental Lien Search

A lien search was obtained from Texas Environmental Research (TER) to gain information regarding environmental cleanup liens and other activity and use limitations, such as engineering controls and institutional controls. A review of the TER lien search revealed that no environmental liens have been filed of public record for the subject property. Eagle Landing L.P. is listed as the current owner and has owned the subject property since December 23, 2003 (grantor AFI Associates Incorporated - Warranty Deed File No. 2309241). A copy of the TER lien search summary for the subject property is attached as Appendix H.

4.6 Chain of Title Search

AE&E was not contracted to procure a formal Chain of Title search as part of this Phase I ESA (see Section 3.1).



5.0 STANDARD PHYSICAL SETTING SOURCES

5.1 Review of Current USGS 7.5 Minute Topographic Map

Review of the Jacksonville Heights, FL 2012 Quadrangle-USGS 7.5 Minute Series depicts the subject property as being situated east of Eagle Landing Parkway and south of Oakleaf Plantation Parkway within a primarily commercial/residential area of Orange Park, Clay County, Florida. No development details are depicted on the 2012 topographic map. Generally, the topography across the immediate area appears to decline to the north towards South Prong Double Branch. No unresolved or topographically up-gradient environmentally sensitive businesses or conditions were noted within the immediate vicinity of the subject property. The subject property appears to be located at an elevation of +/-72 feet National Geodetic Vertical Datum (NGVD) 1929. A copy of the Current USGS Topographic Map is attached as Figure 2.

5.2 Review of NRCS Soil Survey Maps

Review of the current NRCS Soil Survey Maps of Clay County (USDA Soil Survey - 2018 and 1989), Florida, depicts the subject property as lying within an area comprised of Ortega fine sand (10) and Hurricane fine sand (3). Ortega fine sand is generally described as moderately well drained, Eolian or sandy marine deposits in ridges on marine terraces. Slopes range from 0 to 5% and are linear/convex. Hurricane fine sand is generally described as somewhat poorly drained, sandy marine deposits in flats/rises on marine terraces. Slopes range from 0 to 5% and are linear/convex. The subject property is depicted as undeveloped in 1989 (scale and clarity limited this review). No unresolved environmentally sensitive businesses or conditions were noted within the immediate vicinity of the subject property. Copies of the NRCS Soil Survey Maps are attached as Figure 3.

6.0 STANDARD HISTORICAL USE INFORMATION SOURCES

6.1 Aerial Photographs

The aerial photographs obtained from the CCPAO, FDOT APLUS database and UF Digital Collections (PALMM) database were reviewed to gain information concerning past or present development on and in the vicinity of the subject property. The 2020 (tax map), 2010, 2001, 1993, 1982, 1973, 1969, 1953 and 1943 historic aerial photographs were available for this area of Clay County, Florida. The subject property is depicted as undeveloped partially cleared land from at least 1943 to at least 2001. The subject property then appears as seen currently in 2010. A review of the aerial photographs for the area identified no specific environmentally sensitive businesses or conditions located on or near the subject property. Copies of the historic aerials are attached in Appendix C.

6.2 Fire Insurance Maps

Fire insurance maps are normally reviewed to critique historical property usage of the subject property and adjoining properties. Inquiry revealed that fire insurance maps were not available for this portion of Clay County, Florida. The Fire Insurance Map Inquiry is attached as Appendix D.

6.3 City Directories

AE&E representatives reviewed the available Polk's City/Cross-Reference Directories from EDR to obtain information about previous occupants of the subject property and adjoining properties. These directories are normally reviewed at five (5) year intervals to attempt to identify past occupants of the subject property and adjoining properties whose names could suggest activities typically associated with the use, generation, storage, treatment, or disposal of



hazardous materials. Inquiry revealed that city directories were available for this address range of Clay County, Florida from 2010 to 2017. A copy of the city directories inquiry is included in the appendices. The subject property is unlisted throughout and the adjoining properties are listed as Eagle Landing Golf Club/Course (2017-2010). Review of the city directories identified no environmentally sensitive businesses or listings, by name recognition, which would indicate recognized environmental concerns in the immediate vicinity (beyond those previously resolved in the file review section).

6.4 Property Assessor's Office Records

AE&E reviewed the tax assessor's card for the subject property at the Clay County Property Appraiser's Office for information on past uses of the subject property. The results of the inquiry were as follows: Eagle Landing LP owns the subject property. The property use is listed as a conservation easement (9605). The parcel consists of approximately 7.99 acres. Information obtained during our subject property inspection on October 19, 2020, confirmed that the site is currently undeveloped wooded land and a lake. Heating and cooling systems are listed as none. A sales history listing from 2003 lists the parcel as vacant. A copy of the Clay County Property Appraiser's Card is included in Appendix A.

6.5 Building Department Records

AE&E searched the databases provided by the Clay County Building Department for a history of building permits and/or building violations on the subject site. The electronic database contained zero (0) listed permits for the subject property. A copy of the building permit search inquiry is included in Appendix F.

6.6 Historical Topographic Maps

The historical topographic maps obtained from the USGS TopoView website were reviewed to gain information concerning past or present development on and in the vicinity of the subject property. The 2018, 2015, 2012, 1994, 1993, 1988, 1980, 1977, 1964, 1960, 1959, 1957, 1949, 1948, 1941 and 1918 historical topographic maps were available for this area of Clay County, Florida. The 2018, 2015, 2012, 1988, 1980, 1977, 1960, 1959, 1957 and 1948 historical topographic maps do not show development details or the scale is too large. The subject property is depicted as undeveloped throughout the topographic map coverage. A review of the historical topographic maps for the area identified no specific environmentally sensitive businesses or conditions located on or near the subject property.

7.0 SITE/VICINITY RECONNAISSANCE AND INTERVIEWS

The methodology used by AE&E's representative during the subject property and vicinity reconnaissance consisted of a walkover of the subject property and adjoining properties. In addition, a vehicular reconnaissance of the surrounding vicinity and interviews of parties with knowledge information were performed. Details of the subject property and vicinity reconnaissance are summarized in the following sections. Photographs of the subject property and vicinity reconnaissance are included in Appendix G.

7.1 Subject Property & Vicinity Reconnaissance

The purpose of a subject property and vicinity reconnaissance is to visually or physically observe the existing subject property and vicinity conditions with respect to indicators of materials, which may have the potential to adversely affect the subject property. These indicators typically include the presence of 55-gallon drums, chemical containers, waste disposal areas, electrical transformers that may contain Polychlorinated Biphenyls (PCBs), and discolored



surficial soils. Information obtained and observations noted during the subject property and vicinity reconnaissance with respect to the aforementioned items are summarized below. A physical description of the subject property was previously discussed.

- The inspector conducted a survey for the presence of PCBs or PCB containing equipment limited to a visual inspection for the presence of transformers, capacitors, and hydraulic equipment. PCBs were widely used in such equipment until 1979 when EPA banned such use. Many utilities have since acted to replace PCB containing transformers and capacitors with other substances. No transformers were noted on the subject property.
- Reconnaissance of the subject property did not reveal visually and physically observed indications of storage, non-natural solid waste disposal (land filling activity), pits, ponds, lagoons, stressed vegetation, stained soil or pavement, drains, lifts, unidentified substance containers, USTs and/or ASTs on the property (two sand piles and vegetative waste pile noted no evidence of contamination in sand piles and therefore, not a threat to the subject property soil/groundwater).
- Reconnaissance of the adjoining properties did not reveal visually and physically observed indications of storage, use or disposal of hazardous substances or petroleum products, stained soil or pavement, unidentified substance containers, ASTs, non-natural solid waste disposal (land filling activity), pits, ponds, lagoons, stressed vegetation, septic systems or USTs except for the following:
 - ➤ The adjoining properties to the north, east and west are active golf courses (Eagle Landing Golf Course). The course and structures were built in 2005/2006 and the historic usage of DDT, organochlorine pesticides and metals based products (i.e. arsenic) were phased out beginning in the late 1970's and 1980's. Therefore, the adjoining golf courses appear to pose a low threat to the subject property soil/groundwater.
- Reconnaissance of the immediate vicinity properties did not reveal visually and/or physically observed indications of storage, use or disposal of significant quantities of hazardous substances or petroleum products.

7.2 Interviews with Knowledgeable Parties

AE&E attempted to interview the current owner representative but those attempts were unsuccessful during the time constraints of this report.

8.0 DATA GAPS

AE&E has performed a Phase I ESA historic data collection in conformance with the scope and limitations of ASTM Standard E 1527-13 of the subject property. The all appropriate inquiries rule requires that the environmental professional: (1) identify data gaps that remain after the conduct of all required activities; (2) identify the sources of information consulted to address such data gaps; and (3) comment upon the significance of such data gaps with regard to his or her ability to identify conditions indicative of releases or threatened releases of hazardous substances on, at, in, or to the property. During completion of the data gathering, gaps in the historic data can occur which can lead to increased environmental liability and risk. As such, AE&E has provided a summary table to represent the data gaps and a discussion on environmental risk associated with these gaps (below):

AE&E was able to review printed historical sources as far back as 1918 (historic topographic map) during this Phase I ESA investigation. The subject property appears to be undeveloped partially cleared land from at least 1918 to the present (lake excavated between 2003 to 2006).

As data from 1940 or earlier was available, data failure did not occur per ASTM E 1527-13. Additionally, it is our opinion that the data collected adequately covers the historical usage of the subject property and has revealed no excessive data gaps that would result in elevated risk.

9.0 VAPOR INTRUSION

AE&E evaluated the potential for vapor intrusion conditions as part of this investigation. As no on-site RECs associated with volatizing chemicals of concern were identified, the potential for vapor intrusion to occur in the current and/or future site structure(s) appears low.

10.0 CONDITIONS OUTSIDE THE SCOPE OF ASTM PRACTICE E 1527-13

10.1 Asbestos-Containing Material (ACM)

Based upon the unimproved status of the site, the potential for ACM does not exist.

10.2 Lead Based Paint (LBP)

Based upon the unimproved status of the site, the potential for LBP does not exist.



10.3 Limited Microbial Survey

Based upon the unimproved status of the site, the potential for moisture and microbial activity does not exist.

10.4 Wetlands/Flood Zones

Review of the National Wetlands Inventory (NWI) provided by EDR did not indicate the presence of wetlands on the subject property. Review of the FEMA Floodplain Map provided by EDR did not indicate the presence of 100/500 Year Flood Zones on the subject property.

11.0 GENERAL INFORMATION

11.1 Purpose

The Standard Practice for Environmental Site Assessments: Phase I Environmental Site Assessment (ESA) Process, ASTM Designation: E 1527-13, is to define good commercial and customary practice in the United States of America for conducting an environmental site assessment of a parcel of commercial real estate with respect to the range of contaminants within the scope of the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act (CERCLA) (42 U.S.C. §9601) and petroleum products. As such, this practice is intended to permit a *user* to satisfy one of the requirements to qualify for the *innocent landowner*, *contiguous property owner*, or *bona fide prospective purchaser* limitations on CERCLA liability (hereinafter, the "landowner liability protections," or "LLPs"): that is, the practice that constitutes "all appropriate inquiries into the previous ownership and uses of the *property* consistent with good commercial and customary practice as defined at 42 U.S.C. §9601(35)(B).

11.2 Special Terms and Conditions

Recognized Environmental Conditions - In defining a standard of good commercial and customary practice for conducting an ESA of a parcel of property, the goal of the process established by this practice is to identify Recognized Environmental Conditions (RECs). The term recognized environmental conditions means the presence or likely presence of any hazardous substances or petroleum products in, on, or at a property: (1) due to any release to the environment; (2) under conditions indicative of a release to the environment; or (3) under conditions that pose a material threat of a future release to the environment. *De-minimis* conditions are not recognized environmental conditions.

Petroleum Products—Petroleum products are included within the scope of this practice because they are of concern with respect to many parcels of commercial real estate and current custom and usage is to include an inquiry into the presence of petroleum products when doing an environmental site assessment of commercial real estate. Inclusion of petroleum products within the scope of this practice is not based upon the applicability, if any, of CERCLA to petroleum products.

Hazardous Substances - A substance defined as a hazardous substance pursuant to CERCLA 42 USC §9601(14), as interpreted by Federal Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regulations and the courts, which includes: (i) any substances designated pursuant to section 1321(b)(2)(A) of Title 33, (ii) any element, compound, mixture, solution, or substance designated pursuant to 42 USC §9602, (iii) any hazardous waste having the characteristics identified under or listed pursuant to section 3001 of the Solid Waste Disposal Act (42 USC §6921) (but not including any waste for which regulation, under the Solid Waste Disposal Act (42 USC §6901 et seq), has been suspended by Act of Congress), (iv) any toxic pollutant listed under section 112 of the Clean Air Act (42 USC §7412), (v) any imminently hazardous



chemical substance or mixture with respect to which the Administrator (of EPA) has taken action pursuant to section 2606 of Title 15, and (vi) any other substance regulated by the state.

No additional special terms and conditions, apart from the contractual agreements that are delineated within our Proposal were executed in the performance of this project. Additional acronyms and definitions are detailed in Appendix J.

11.3 Limitations and Exceptions of Assessment

This Phase I ESA has been conducted to permit formulation of an opinion as to the presence or likely presence of recognized environmental conditions in connection with the subject property. Opinions relative to the recognized environmental conditions potential given in this report are based upon information derived from the most recent subject property reconnaissance and from other activities described herein. The client is herewith advised that the conditions observed by AE&E are subject to change. The findings and opinions conveyed via this Phase I ESA report are based on information obtained from a variety of sources that AE&E believes are reliable. Nonetheless, AE&E cannot, and does not, guarantee the authenticity or reliability of the information it has relied upon.

AE&E has endeavored to meet what it believes is the applicable standard of care observed by consultants performing environmental site assessments contemporaneously in the geographical area of the project and, in so doing, is obliged to advise the client of Phase I ESA limitations. AE&E believes that providing information about limitations is essential to help the client identify and thereby manage its risks. Because standards of care can be identified only through retrospective inquiry, AE&E has assumed that the standard of care is articulated by ASTM Standard E 1527-13 as interpreted herein. As stated within ASTM Standard E 1527-13, no environmental site assessment can wholly eliminate uncertainty regarding the potential for recognized environmental conditions in connection with a property. Performance of practice ASTM Standard E 1527-13 is intended to reduce, but not eliminate, uncertainty regarding the potential for recognized environmental conditions in connection with a property, and recognizes reasonable limits of time and cost. In addition, per ASTM Standard E 1527-13, discretionary physical setting sources shall be sought and reviewed only when conditions have been identified in which hazardous substances or petroleum products are likely to migrate to the property or from or within the property into the soil or groundwater.

ASTM Standard E 1527-13 requires consulting historical sources to develop a history of all obvious uses of the subject property from the present, back to the subject property's obvious first developed use, or back to 1940, whichever is earlier. To accomplish this task, ASTM Standard E 1527-13 requires reviewing only as many of the standard historical sources listed in the ASTM Standard E 1527-13 that are necessary, reasonably ascertainable, and likely to be useful (defined as data failure if not possible).

In our experience, aerial photographs, fire insurance maps, interviews with parties knowledgeable about the subject property history, building and zoning records, property assessor record cards and, to a lesser extent, recorded land titles are typically the standard historical sources likely to yield information which fulfills ASTM Standard E 1527-13 as related to identifying the first developed subject property use and adjoining property uses which are considered environmentally sensitive. Past experience in utilizing the remaining standard historical sources, as delineated in the standard, has not been, in the opinion of the undersigned authors, sufficiently useful, accurate, or complete in terms of satisfying the standard, hence, our selection of historical resources.

It should be noted that the client is the only intended beneficiary of this report. This report and its findings contained herein shall not, in whole or in part, be disseminated or conveyed to any other third party, nor used by any other party in whole or in part, without the prior written consent of AE&E and the client.



Finally, the geographic database search utilized for this project meets the ASTM Standard E 1527-13 requirements for a government records review. The minimum search distance is defined in ASTM Standard E 1527-13. Accordingly, it is possible that the referenced information research, while fully appropriate for a Phase I ESA, may not indicate the existence of important information sources. Assuming such sources actually exist, their information could not have been considered in the formulation of our findings and opinions.

11.4 Limiting Conditions

No specific on-site limiting conditions were noted during the site visit that could impair AE&E's ability to meet the objectives of ASTM Standard E 1527-13.

11.5 Methodology

The scope of service conducted was completed in general accordance with ASTM Standard E 1527-13, and tasks outlined within our proposal.

11.6 Recommendations

The all appropriate inquiries regulation requires that the prospective property owner and environmental professional take into account information collected during the inquiries in considering the degree of obviousness of the presence or likely presence of hazardous substances on, at, or in the subject property. They should also take into account the information collected during the inquiries in considering the ability to detect contamination by appropriate investigation. The all appropriate inquiries rule, however, requires that the environmental professional also provide in the written report an opinion regarding additional appropriate investigation that may be necessary, if any. The opinion could include activities or considerations outside the scope of the all appropriate inquiries investigation that might help the prospective property owner to more fully characterize environmental conditions on the property.


Figure 1 Site Location Map






Figure 3 USDA Soil Survey









Activity and Use Limitations (AULs) are one indication of a past or present release of a hazardous substance or petroleum products. AULs are an explicit recognition by federal, tribal, state, or local regulatory agency that residual levels of hazardous substances or petroleum products may be present on a property, and that unrestricted use of the property may not be acceptable. AULs are important to both the user and the use of the Environmental Professional. Specifically, the Environmental Professional can review agency records and IC/EC registries for the presence of AULs on the property to determine if a recognized environmental condition is present on the Subject Site.

Approximate Minimum Search Distance (AMSD) is defined as the area for which records must be obtained and reviewed pursuant to ASTM Practice E 1527-13 to the limitations provided in Section 8, Records Review. This may include areas outside the *Subject Site* and is measured from the nearest *Subject Site* property boundary. The term is used in lieu of radius to include irregularly shaped properties.

Controlled Recognized Environmental Condition is defined as a recognized environmental condition resulting from a past release of hazardous substances or petroleum products that has been addressed to the satisfaction of the applicable regulatory authority (for example, as evidenced by the issuance of a no further action letter or equivalent, or meeting risk-based criteria established by regulatory authority), with hazardous substances or petroleum products allowed to remain in place subject to the implementation of required controls (for example, property use restrictions, activity and use limitations, institutional controls, or engineering controls). A condition considered by the Environmental Professional to be a controlled recognized environmental condition shall be listed in the findings section of the Phase I Environmental Site Assessment report, and as a recognized environmental condition in the conclusions section of the Phase I Environmental Site Assessment report.

Data Gap is defined as a lack of or inability to obtain information required by ASTM Practice E 1527-13 despite good faith efforts by the environmental professional to gather such information. Data gaps may result from incompleteness in any of the activities required by ASTM Practice E 1527-13, including, but not limited to site reconnaissance (e.g., an inability to contact the site visit) and interviews (e.g., an inability to interview the key site manager and regulatory officials).

Due Diligence is defined as the process of inquiring into the environmental characteristics of a parcel of commercial real estate or other conditions, usually in connections with a commercial real estate transaction. The degree and kind of due diligence vary for different properties and differing purposes.

Environmental Controls (EC) are defined as physical modifications to a site or facility (e.g., capping, slurry walls, or point of use water treatment) to reduce or eliminate the potential for exposure to hazardous substances or petroleum products in soil and groundwater on the *Subject Site*. Engineering controls are a type of activity and use limitation (AUL).

Environmental Lien is defined as a charge, security, or encumbrance upon title to a property to secure the payment of a cost, damage, debt, obligation, or duty arising out of repsonse actions, cleanups, or other remediation of hazardous substances or petroleum products upon a property, including but not limited to liens imposed pursuant to CERCLA 42 USC §§9607(1) and 907(r) and similar state and local laws.

Environmental Professional is defined as a person meeting the education, training, and experience requirements as set forth in 40 CFR §312.10(b):



- (1) A person who possesses sufficient specific education, training, and experience necessary to exercise professional judgment to develop opinions and conclusions regarding conditions indicative of releases or threatened releases (see 40 CFR §312.1(c)) on, at, in, or to a property, sufficient to meet the objectives and performance factors in §312.20(e) and (f).
- (2) Such a person must: (i) hold a current Professional Engineer's or Professional Geologist's license or registration from a state, tribe, or U.S. territory (or the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico) and have the equivalent of three (3) years of full-time relevant experience; or (ii) be licensed or certified by the federal government, a state, tribe, or U.S. territory (or the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico) to perform environmental inquiries as defined in §312.21 and have the equivalent of three (3) years of full-time relevant experience; or (iii) have a Baccalaureate or higher degree from an accredited institution of higher education in a discipline of engineering or science and the equivalent of five (5) years of full-time relevant experience; or (iv) have the equivalent of ten (10) years of full-time relevant experience.
- (3) An environmental professional should remain current in his or her field through participation in continuing education or other activities.
- (4) The definition of environmental professional provided above does not preempt state professional licensing or registration requirements such as those for a professional geologist, engineer, or site remediation professional. Before commencing work, a person should determine the applicability of state professional licensing or registration laws to the activities to be undertaken as part of the inquiry identified in §312.21(b).
- (5) A person who does not qualify as an environmental professional under the foregoing definition may assist in the conduct of all appropriate inquiries in accordance with this part if such person is under the supervision or responsible charge of a person meeting the definition of an environmental professional provided above when conducting such activities.

Environmental Site Assessment is defined as the process by which a person or entity seeks to determine if a particular parcel of real property (including improvements) is subject to *recognized environmental conditions*. At the option of the user, an environmental site assessment may include more inquiry or, if the user is concerned about qualifying for the Landowner Liability Protections (LLPs), less inquiry than that constituting all appropriate inquiry. An environmental site assessment is both different from and less rigorous than an environmental compliance audit.

Fill Dirt is defined as dirt, soil, sand, or other earth, that is obtained off-site, that is used to fill holes or depressions, create mounds, or otherwise artificially change the grade or elevation of real property. It does not include material that is used in limited quantities for normal landscaping activities.

Good Faith is defined as the absence of any intention to seek an unfair advantage or to defraud another party; an honest and sincere intention to fulfill one's obligations in the conduct or transaction concerned.

Hazardous Substance is defined pursuant to CERCLA 42 USC §9601(14), as interpreted by EPA regulations and the courts: (A) any substance designated pursuant to Section 1321(b)(2)(A) of Title 33, (B) any element, compound, mixture, solution, or substance designated pursuant to Section 9602 of this title, (c) any hazardous waste having the characteristics identified under or listed pursuant to Section 3001 of the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA), as amended (42 USC §6921), but not including any waste the regulation



of which under RCRA (42§§6901 et seq.) has been suspended by Act of Congress, (D) any toxic hazardous air pollutant listed under Section 1317(a) of Title 33, (E) any hazardous air pollutant listed under Section 1112 of the Clean Air Act (42 USC §7412), and (F) any immediately hazardous chemical substance or mixture with respect to which the Administrator of EPA has taken action pursuant to Section 2606 of Title 15. The term does not include petroleum, including crude oil or any fraction thereof which is not otherwise specifically listed or designated as a hazardous substance under subparagraphs (A) through (F) of this definition. The term does not include natural gas, natural gas liquids, liquefied natural gas and such synthetic gas.

Hazardous Waste is defined as having the characteristics identified under or listed pursuant to section 3001 of RCRA, as amended (42 USC §6921) (but not including any waste the regulation of which under RCRA (42 USC§§6901-6992k) has been suspended by Act of Congress). RCRA is sometimes also identified as the Solid Waste Disposal Act. RCRA defines a "hazardous waste", at 42 USC §6903, as a solid waste, or combination of solid wastes, which because of its quantity, concentration, or physical, chemical, or infectious characteristics may: (A) cause, or significantly contribute to an increase in mortality or an increase in serious irreversible, or incapacitating reversible illness; or (B) pose a substantial present or potential hazard to human health or the environment when improperly treated, stored, transported, or disposed of, or otherwise managed.

Historical Recognized Environmental Condition is defined as a past release of any hazardous substances or petroleum products that has occurred in connection with the *Subject Site* and has been addressed to the satisfaction of the applicable regulatory authority or meeting unrestricted use criteria established by a regulatory authority, without subjecting the property to any required controls (for example, property use restrictions, activity and use limitations, institutional controls, or engineering controls). Before calling the past release a *historical recognized environmental condition*, the Environmental Professional must determine whether the past release is a *recognized environmental condition* at the time the Phase I Environmental Site Assessment is conducted (for example, if there has been a change in the regulatory criteria). If the EP considers the past release to be a *recognized environmental condition* at the time the Phase I ESA is conducted, the condition shall be included in the conclusions section of the report as a *recognized environmental condition*.

Institutional Controls (IC) are defined as a legal or administrative restriction (e.g., deed restrictions restrictive covenants) on the use of, or access to, a site or facility to (1) reduce or eliminate potential exposure to hazardous substances or petroleum products in the soil or groundwater on the *Subject Site*, or (2) to prevent activities that could interfere with the effectiveness of a response action, in order to ensure maintenance of a condition of no significant risk to public health or the environmental. An institutional control is a type of Activity and Use Limitation (AUL).

Landowner Liability Protections (LLPs) means landowner liability protections under CERCLA; those protections include the *bona fide* perspective purchaser liability protection, contiguous property owner liability protection, and innocent landowner defense from CERCLA liability (see 42 USC §§9601(35)(A), 9601(40), 9607(b), 9607(q) and 9607(r)).

Major Occupants means those tenants, subtenants, or other persons or entities each of which uses at least 40% of the leasable area or any anchor tenant when the Subject Site is a shopping center.

Material Threat is defined as a physical observable or obvious threat that is reasonably likely to lead to a release that, in the opinion of the environmental professional, is threatening and might result in impact to public health or the environment. An example might include an aboveground storage tank that contains a hazardous substance and which shows evidence of damage. The damage would represent a material threat if it is deemed



serious enough that it may cause or contribute to tank integrity failure with a release of contents to the environment.

Obvious is defined as that which is plain or evident; a condition or fact that could not be ignored or overlooked by a reasonable observer while visually or physically observing the *Subject Site*.

Occupants mean those tenants, subtenants, or other persons or entities using the *Subject Site* or a portion of the *Subject Site*.

Operator is defined as the person responsible for the overall operation of the facility.

Owner generally means the fee owner of record of the Subject Site.

Petroleum Exclusion means the exclusion from CERCLA liability provided in 42 USC §9601(14), as interpreted by the courts and EPA: "The term (hazardous substance) does not include petroleum, including crude oil or any fraction thereof which is not otherwise specifically listed or designated as a hazardous substance under Subparagraphs (A) through (F) of this paragraph, and the term does not include natural gas, natural gas liquids, liquefied natural gas, and synthetic gas usable for fuel (or mixtures of natural gas, and synthetic gas)."

Petroleum Products mean those substances included within the meaning of the petroleum exclusion to CERCLA, 42 USC §9601(14), as interpreted by the courts and EPA, that is: petroleum, including crude oil and any fraction thereof which is not otherwise specifically listed or designated as a hazardous substance under Subparagraphs (A) through (F) or 42 USC §9601(14), natural gas, natural gas liquids, liquefied natural gas, and synthetic gas usable for fuel (or mixtures of natural gas, and synthetic gas). Note: the word fraction refers to certain distillates of crude oil, including gasoline, kerosene, diesel oil, jet fuels, and fuel oil, pursuant to the Standard Definitions of Petroleum Statistics.

Phase I Environmental Site Assessment is defined as the process described in *Standard Practice for Environmental Site Assessments: Phase I Environmental Site Assessment Process*, American Society for Testing and Materials Practice E 1527-13.

Recognized Environmental Conditions (RECs) is defined as the presence or likely presence of any hazardous substances or petroleum products in, on, or at the *Subject Site*: (1) due to release to the environment; (2) under conditions indicative of a release to the environment; or (3) under conditions that pose a material threat of a future release to the environment. This term is not intended to include *de minimis* conditions that generally do not present a material risk of harm to public health or the environment and that generally would not be the subject of an enforcement action if brought to the attention of appropriate government agencies.

Relevant Experience, as used in the definition of Environmental Professional in Standard Practice for Environmental Site Assessments: Phase I Environmental Site Assessment Process, American Society for Testing and Materials Practice E 1527-13 means participation in the performance of all appropriate inquiries investigations, environmental site assessments, or other site investigations that may include environmental analyses, investigations, and remediation which involve the understanding of surface and subsurface environmental conditions and the processes used to evaluate these conditions and for which professional judgment was used to develop opinions regarding conditions indicative of releases or threatened releases to the Subject Site.



Site Reconnaissance is defined as part of *Standard Practice for Environmental Site Assessments: Phase I Environmental Site Assessment Process*, American Society for Testing and Materials Practice E 1527-13 that addresses what should be done in connection with the site visit. BONUS POLICY

1.0 POLICY OVERVIEW

- 1.1 This Bonus Policy ("Policy") is designed to set forth guidelines and metrics for the evaluation of Honours Golf Company, LLC ("Honours Golf") for bonus eligibility, pursuant to the *Management Services Agreement*, dated July 31, 2018, as amended and supplemented ("Agreement"), by and between the South Village Community Development District ("District") and Honours Golf.
- 1.2 Any and all questions regarding this Policy should be directed to the District Manager or District Counsel.

2.0 BONUS STRUCTURE

- **2.1** The District's Board of Supervisors ("Board") may, in its discretion and pursuant to evaluation metrics provided for herein, award bonus compensation to Honours Golf. The decision to award a bonus is solely within the discretion of the Board and is not guaranteed pay.
- 2.2 Honours Golf is eligible for bonus compensation for the fiscal year starting on October 1, 2019 and each successive fiscal year. Bonus compensation shall not exceed twelve percent (12%) of the base fee for each fiscal year, as described in the Agreement.
- 2.3 Score Calculation. The Board shall score Honours Golf pursuant to the Individual Supervisor Scorecards ("Scorecards"), attached hereto as Exhibit A. Each Supervisor will use the Individual Supervisor Scorecard to produce an averaged individual score. The District Manager (or any Supervisor) will then use the Final Score Scorecard to average the five (5) individual scores to produce an averaged final score ("Final Score"). The Final Score will be used to determine the level of bonus compensation awarded to Honours Golf.
- 2.4 Bonus Compensation. Honours Golf must earn a Final Score of at least 3 to receive bonus compensation. Under the Agreement, the maximum bonus award is 12% of the Base Fee provided for by the Agreement. For Fiscal Year 2020/2021, the maximum bonus amount is \$20,160. The bonus compensation is set forth as follows:

Final Score	Bonus Compensation Award
3.0 - 3.4	\$5,040
3.5 - 3.9	\$10,080
4.0 – 4.4	\$15,120
4.5 – 5.0	\$20,160

As the Base Fee increases, the bonus compensation award increments shall increase proportionately as well.

Amenity Centers:

1. Aquatic Center/Kids Club/Cafe

- a. All team members have been actively engaged sanitizing all areas of the pool deck and buildings prior to opening, throughout the day and after we close.
- b. Sunday, November 1st was the last day of lifeguards meaning the slide and diving boards are closed for the season. Swimming pools are now swim at your own risk until Spring Break.
- c. Cabana Bar sales solid for October at \$6,000, exceeding budget.
- d. Pressure washed back walk to Cabana Bar and started cleaning awnings on deck.
- e. Started replacing broken straps on lounge chairs.

2. Athletic Center

- a. Full month of key card access to workout facility without issue as well as allowing guests.
- b. In person fitness classes have returned to a limited offering.
- c. Replacement weight stack pins received and installed.
- d. Smith machine linear bearing has been replaced.
- e. Pickleball has started back with limited play inside, TJ is leading the program.
- f. Outdoor pickleball nets and balls have been received. Almost all pickleball clinics have been held outdoors since.
- g. The construction of the tennis and pickleball pro-shop is coming together nicely. The wall has been built with the windows and door installed. Finishing trim and sheet rock is being completed this week with painting. Started receiving merchandise.

3. Activities

- a. Most all organized activities have been suspended for the month of October due to Covid-19. We will begin to look at what activities we can host for kids.
- b. Karen will be hosting a small art class in November where the participants will be decorating holiday wine bottles.
- b. Rachael has been in contact with new residents and providing necessary documents for membership. 18 new resident households have met with Rachael for member setup in September.
- c. On average, 1470 email blasts continue to go out every week using the website services. Special emails and communications have gone out regarding facility openings and modified operations due to Covid-19 concerns and restrictions.
- d. Community Garage Sale is scheduled for Saturday, November 14th.
- e. The Supervisor of Elections office had 9,195 people Early Vote at the Resident's Club!

4. Tennis

- a. Remaining safe All baskets, chairs, tables and other touch points sanitized multiple times a day.
- b. New tennis programming which started in October has increase participation.
- c. Senior tennis clinics are averaging 2-4 players each time.

- d. Adult beginner is averaging 9 players.
- e. Men's night is averaging 7 guys.
- f. Ladies night is bringing an average of 6 women.
- g. Junior tennis is at the max of 12 players.
- h. 24 players attended our French Open social. Great fun was had by all and well received with F&B's involvement and offerings.

Golf and Clubhouse Operations:

Golf Operations

- a. A busy month of October with 4800 rounds.
- b. Weekly member groups had a great turnout in October. 1020 member rounds.
- c. Range activity was good over the past month with 1,150 users and \$3,800 in revenue.
- d. Sales in the golf shop were solid this month with \$12,200 in sales.
- e. We hosted the 1st annual Battle of the Neighborhoods. Quail Hollow won the event.

Clubhouse F&B

- a. Even with returning to full occupancy inside, we continue to see some apprehension with larger groups. We seems to be the case with events as well
- b. Operations have improved and we have gotten multiple compliments concerning service, as well as, "Best Club" recognition by *Restaurant Guru Online App*
- c. Sanitization continues to be a strong focus, with the pandemic continuing.
- d. We received an inspection from the state and had very little issues, as well as being complemented by the supervising inspector, as to our operational practices.
- e. We have had some positive staffing additions, and have had limited turnover, but have retained a full staff. We have also been able to share staffing with the recreation side, which strengthens the operation and benefits the staff.
- f. We continue solid results against the plan in October. The club continues to do a few small events, as well as being able to return Trivia night to the weekly schedule. We have begun to see some golf tournaments with F&B as part of the event
- g. Sundays are steady football with the NFL ticket. Improved weather conditions should continue to benefit beverage cart revenue, especially after backing up the old cart with a rental until our new cart arrives in January.
- h. The holiday seasons looks to be a reduction of events compared to previous years, but remains fairly strong even with reduced party sizes.
- i. The "new" menu is in soft rollout, as we prepare to debut the complete version in November, as well as returning to a traditional menu, and move away from the paper version.

Golf Course Maintenance

- 1. The first application of fall/winter pre-emergent herbicide was applied to fairways, tees and rough to prevent poa annua and other winter weeds.
- 2. A pre-emergent was applied to the putting greens to prevent poa annua germination.
- 3. The well head to maintenance pump was replaced. There was a leak in the galvanized pipe that caused the pump to run continuously.
- 4. All cart paths and sprinkler heads were edged
- 5. Valve boxes, yardage plates, drains, bulkheads and lake banks were trimmed
- 6. Front 9 lake banks were sprayed for weeds and mole crickets. Back 9 to follow in November
- 7. Repaired weeping heads on 1,3,4,8,9,10,14,16,18
- 8. Maintenance Facility storm drains were cleared of obstructions
- 9. Sod was added to the member's green to fill in voids

Common Areas & Retention Ponds:

- 1. All lakes have been treated and inspected by the Lake Doctors. Written reports are submitted after each treatment. Algae has been cyclical in many ponds but overall health has been good and steady. The Lake doctors continue to be responsive to our requests for additional treatments and adding dye where beneficial.
- 2. Landscape and facility LED lighting replacements continue for all facilities.
- 3. The waterfall vault has not changed and the suction baskets continue to be cleaned about once every other month now.
- 4. The missing sidewalk section on Autumn Pines has been poured. Vintage Estates has funded it.
- 5. Preparing to start decorating for Christmas 2nd week of November!

Landscaping:

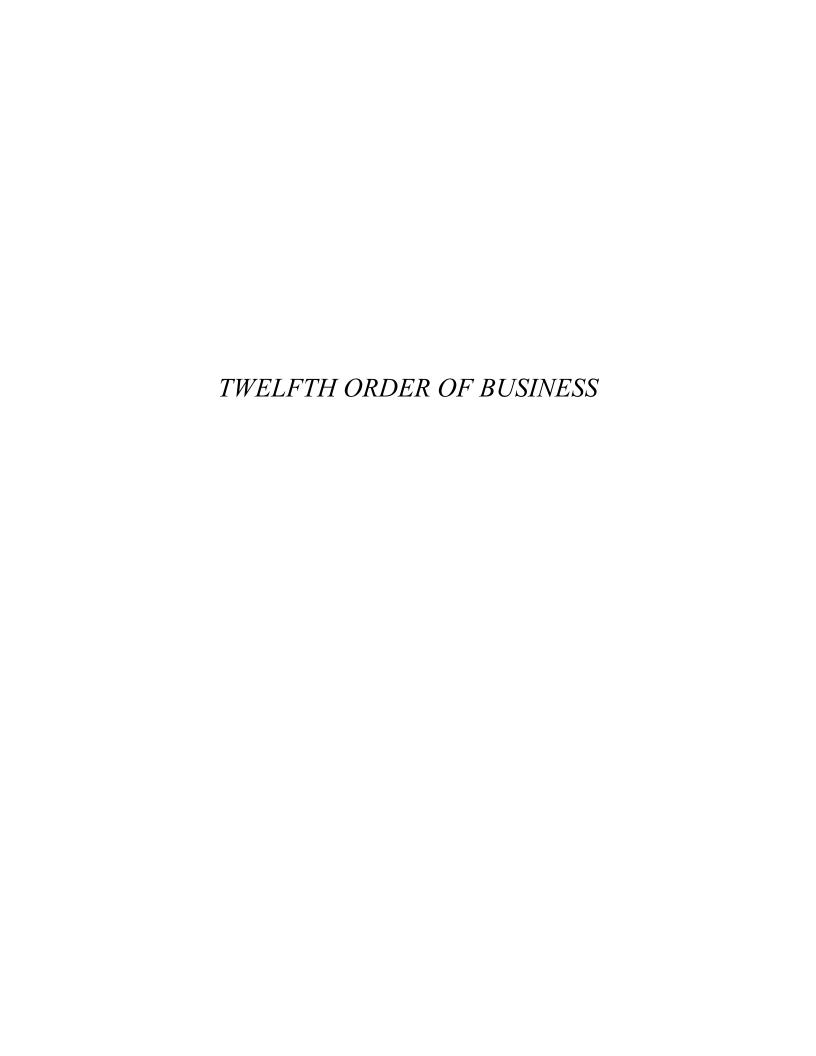
- 1. Director of Operations confers with Tree Amigos Landscape on a weekly basis. Grounds are being maintained per the contract.

 - c. Applied two follow up applications of herbicide to the field in front of Clubhouse and spot treated other turf areas to get rid of crabgrass.
 - d. Detailed and trimmed all plant material on Parkway and neighborhood signs.
 - e. Replaced sod in center island where a car ran through it, also along exit side by clubhouse.
 - f. Weedeated and cleaned up area around new amenity area in Oakland Hills.
 - g. Cleaned up beds at waterfall area at main entrance.
 - h. Started landscaped enhancement in front of golf clubhouse.
 - i. Will clean up island in center of lake at amenity center the 2nd week of November.

Misc:

- 1. Answered numerous phone calls, emails and visits from residents, contractors, vendors and other persons with inquiries. The subjects included, golf course maintenance, easement encroachments, alligators, lake maintenance, directions, repairs, drainage (both County and CDD owned), dead trees, vandalism, security, etc
 - 2. Facilities are inspected on a weekly basis
 - 3. The parks and playgrounds are inspected weekly and required repairs are made.
 - 4. Daily trash pickup along parkway, park sites and common areas.
 - 5. Amenity and common area cameras reviewed frequently; recordings provided to CCSO.
