The following is a summary of the actions taken at the May 4, 2021 meeting. An audio copy of the proceedings can be obtained by contacting the District Manager.

FIRST ORDER OF BUSINESS Roll Call

Mr. Oliver called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. and called the roll.

SECOND ORDER OF BUSINESS Audience Comments

A resident stated based on the potential election for Grant's seat make sure that the candidates are basically in good standing with accounts based on the fact that a number of us are not in good standing.

THIRD ORDER OF BUSINESS

Approval of the Minutes of the April 6, 2021

Meeting

On MOTION by Mr. Payton seconded by Mr. Krueger with all in favor the minutes of the April 6, 2021 meeting were approved as presented.

FOURTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Acceptance of the Minutes of the April 6, 2021 Audit Committee Meeting

On MOTION by Mr. Payton seconded by Mr. Krueger with all in favor the minutes of the April 6, 2021 audit committee meeting were accepted.

FIFTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Update Regarding Open Items

A. Update Regarding Weir Repairs

Mr. Acree stated the structure is in production and scheduled to be shipped the week of May 12th and will probably be onsite the week of May 17th to prepare for construction. Since January of this year DEP has taken over all permitting from the Army Corps of Engineers regarding the wetlands and they are severely understaffed and don't have the qualifications to deal with everything it has to do. Every project that gets submitted to the district you get the exact response from DEP saying they have jurisdiction over the wetlands. The water management district wants a permit modification application fee and a little more detail on the plans for erosion control and we are working on that right now to get it back to them this week.

Mr. Oliver stated one sticking point is still the access point.

Mr. Biagetti stated we came up with an agreement the board has seen and Mrs. Burns who lives at the end of the cu-de-sac has been working with us through this process and today there is just a slight change that we don't feel is going to hold anything up, that we will have a signed agreement tomorrow morning. With this additional request it is still the best option for everybody involved.

Ms. Buchanan stated someone put if we damage his driveway we are being asked to replace the entire driveway.

Mr. Hahn stated his position is if you repair one section and not the entire driveway it won't match.

Ms. Buchanan stated asking for this compared to eminent domain power, we are a little over the barrel. I think based on conversations with the contractor that is the preferable route but not the only option.

- Mr. Hahn stated it is an additional \$4,000 to replace the driveway.
- Mr. Randy Smith stated there should be a statute of limitations once the work is complete that the homeowner can come back and say we caused the damage to the driveway, that it wasn't visibly damaged.
- Ms. Buchanan asked if a crack shows up 11 months later? I don't know with the nature of concrete if that is possible. To the extent we want to tie off that loop we certainly can.
 - Mr. Randy Smith asked do you think damage would appear immediately to the concrete?
 - Mr. Acree responded you see it sooner in the process than later.
 - Mr. Randy Smith stated we need something reasonable to protect them as well as us.
- Ms. Buchanan stated I will get with Alex and see what a reasonable period is. I think we will be in a situation where it cracks very quickly.

B. Phase 5 Construction Update

Mr. Biagetti stated we are still working through some things. It has been delayed. I saw a gentleman measuring for the neighborhood sign. Hopefully, they are getting through permitting and getting ready to start on that. We should start seeing these improvements and changes happen.

C. Street Sign Replacements

Mr. Biagetti stated the chairman at the last meeting requested us to do a street sign inventory throughout the community and we have done that. We have signs from the county, we are now waiting for the new brackets. As we have been doing throughout the community for the past few years, we put it on hold for a little bit, but we are replacing any old, original signs with the county issued replacement signs and the simple wing brackets.

SIXTH ORDER OF BUSINESS Discussion of Honours Golf Contract Renewal Process

Mr. Oliver stated the end of the three-year term will be September 30, 2021. The original contract started on August 18, 2018. The sooner we get started the sooner we can plug that number

into the budget that you will be adopting later this summer. We can ask them now to provide a proposal.

Mr. Hahn stated okay, I will contact Honours and get that.

SEVENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS Board Guidance Regarding Preparation of Fiscal Year 2022 Proposed Budget

Mr. Oliver stated as we look at the budget projections throughout this fiscal year it looks like we will have a modest surplus in golf and recreation, which is surprising given the up and down that we have. It looks like the FY22 assessment will be exactly where they were despite the increase in insurance. Is there any guidance the board wants to establish?

Mr. Randy Smith stated Jim and I have had discussions regarding the pending increases in wages. I want to be sure that we don't lose good people because we were late to trigger increase in pay and meet the requirements we will be facing the first of October. I think you have factored that into your budget. I need to be sure the way things are going if that is going to be enough of an increase or do we need to budget more?

Mr. Hahn stated I factored that in the fiscal year 2022 budget already. A lot of our key people are over that \$10 barrier but there are going to be a lot of things going on in the work environment everywhere and it is going to be very competitive.

EIGHTH ORDER OF BUSINESS Staff Reports

A. General Manager - Report

A copy of the operations report was included as part of the agenda package and included the operations of the amenity center, athletic center, tennis facility, golf and clubhouse operations, common areas and retention ponds and landscaping.

Mr. Hahn stated we have taken the time to get some professional groups out here to evaluate our courts and get a sense of how our courts are and what kind of work if we wanted to do renovations to them, if they need work in the eyes of professionals. We had two firms that came out and have a couple different bids. One feeling a lot more play is needed, one feeling not as much play is needed. We are working on getting some bids that we may bring to the board down the road if we want to take the steps to give the tennis courts a little facelift. We have been maintaining them ourselves on an annual basis, putting in clay and doing that part of it and that is in our operating budget, but this is above and beyond that. The bids are anywhere from \$28,000

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to \$50,000 and I wanted you to be aware we are looking at that. I have never heard complaints about the courts that they are not in good playing condition I have heard that they are in good playing condition. This is the professional people telling me what they think we need and we will look at that down the road.

I have had three meetings with the folks from Golfweek. Golfweek has an international junior event, some of the best junior players in the world based on world rankings. They host this event at courses like Grand Cypress, Reunion, ChampionsGate, Disney courses, Hammock Beach. It is a high-profile event, and they want to bring something to Jacksonville, and they met with the folks at Florida First Coast of Golf, and they recommended Eagle Landing. I had business with these folks out on the golf course. They are very pleased and excited about what they see on the golf course and are willing to bring their tournament to us. We have plenty of time to focus on it. The reason I'm bringing it up to the board is they are asking for a Saturday and Sunday. They will inundate our golf course both Saturday morning and Sunday morning. We will have both afternoons available. We will be hosting 80 - 85 of the best male junior players here and I will negotiate a price with them because I know how prestigious this event is. This isn't something you lowball. I have \$75 per player already guaranteed from Golfweek for them to play. That will give us a full greens fee for each player and they don't take carts and we are going to get about \$60 for every kid that walks out on the golf course and plays and we will get all the rental carts from the adults and parents that are showing up to watch these kids play. Kids from all over the world are coming here with their families. It becomes a winner for us from a financial standpoint based on our revenues we generate right now. The downfall is we are taking one weekend in November from the membership and I would like to get direction from the board if you would like to do that. They are asking that I get back with them soon because they have to get a course that is committed.

It was the consensus of the board to approve having this tournament.

Mr. Hahn stated I'm getting quotes to replace the hardware for all the doors and replace all the doors and he then updated the board on the screen installation, dog park grand opening

Mr. Oliver stated there are only two lots that have not paid and that money goes into the capital reserves.

Mr. Randy Smith stated this is to fill one seat but there is an election a year from November for three seats and I encourage all of you to consider running in that election.

On MOTION by Mr. Payton seconded by Mr. Rick Smith with all in favor Allan Brink was appointed to fill seat 5.

Mr. Oliver being a notary public of the State of Florida administered the oath of office to Mr. Brink.

Ms. Buchanan stated you are now a public official and you are subject to the ethics law, Sunshine law and along with that you have to keep your CDD records available to the extent you want to keep them. They are subject to the public records law and I suggest you put them somewhere separate from your personal or business records in the event there is a public records requeset. Call me with any questions.

Mr. Payton stated you are going to have to fill out some forms after the meeting.

Following is a brief description of each employee classification:

Staff Accountant – Staff accountants work directly under the constant supervision of the auditor-in-charge and, are responsible for the various testing of documents, account analysis and any other duties as his/her supervisor believes appropriate. Minimum qualification for a staff accountant is graduation from an accredited university or college with a degree in accounting or equivalent.

Senior Accountant – A senior accountant must possess all the qualifications of the staff accountant, in addition to being able to draft the necessary reports and financial statements, and supervise other staff accountants when necessary.

Managers – A manager must possess the qualifications of the senior accountant, plus be able to work without extensive supervision from the auditor-in-charge. The manager should be able to draft audit reports from start to finish and to supervise the audit team, if necessary.

The Tax Reform Act of 1986 requires issuers of most tax-exempt obligations to pay (i.e., "rebate") to the United States government any arbitrage profits. Arbitrage profits are earnings on the investment of bond proceeds and certain other monies in excess of what would have been earned had such monies been invested at a yield equal to the yield on the bonds.

Federal tax law requires that interim rebate calculations and payments are due at the end of every fifth bond year. Final payment is required upon redemption of the bonds. More frequent calculations may be deemed advisable by an issuer's auditor, trustee or bond counsel or to assure that accurate and current records are available. These more frequent requirements are usually contained in the Arbitrage or Rebate Certificate with respect to the bonds.

Our firm performs a comprehensive rebate analysis and includes the following:

- Verifying that the issue is subject to rebate;
- Calculating the bond yield;
- Identifying, and separately accounting for, all "Gross Proceeds" (as that term is defined in the Code) of the bond issue, including those requiring analysis due to "transferred proceeds" and/or "commingled funds" circumstances;
- Determining what general and/or elective options are available to Gross proceeds of the issue:
- Calculating the issue's excess investment earning (rebate liability), if any;
- Delivering appropriate documentation to support all calculations:

- Assisting as necessary in the event of an Internal Revenue Service inquiry; and,

Amenity Centers:

1. Aquatic Center/Kids Club/Cafe

- a. Summer Camp registrations have opened utilizing the website program registration feature. Limited to 20 spots available but registrations have been slower to come in.
- b. Clubroom rentals have been busy on the weekends. This includes birthday parties, baby showers, small wedding showers and graduation parties.
- c. Waterslide check valve on the upper end has been replaced.
- d. Eagle Rays Summer Swim Team has 80 swimmers which is a great turnout with a cancelled season last year! Eagle Landing will be hosting 3 home swim meets this year.
- e. Water Aerobics has started again with a good core of 6 participants on average.
- f. Have been working on tracking down a short in the pool speaker system.
- g. Café is gearing up and ready to serve our residents Memorial Weekend and will be open full time once school is out. Installed new cooler display area with storage cabinet to match existing woodwork.

2. Athletic Center

- a. Divider curtain in basketball court has been repaired and fully operational.
- b. Two new rowers have been ordered and will be replacing the water rower.
- d. Recumbent bike and upright bike will be repaired on 5/25. Have been waiting on parts.
- e. New workout mats have been delivered and placed for resident use.
- f. Mother's Day sale in the pro-shop generated some nice sales!
- g. TJ's pickleball program sees continued steady usage between group clinics and private lessons.

- a. Roughly 150 people attended the Dog Park Pawty which turned out to be a great event with two Disconnected K9 shows, bounce houses, field activities, F&B and CCSO tent and K9 unit.
- b. Rachael had 23 new resident orientations in May.

4. Tennis

a. Getting ready for Tennis Summer Camp, which is always a hit and great activity for our residents.

- b. Clinics on average 6 for Women's Night, 5 for Men's Night and 1 person every other beginner clinic. 8 players on average for the senior/intermediate clinic during May which is huge!!! All junior classes have been full.
- c. We have been dialing in the court irrigation boxes and replacing valves where needed to be ready for the heat/rain that is sure to come.

Golf and Clubhouse Operations:

Golf Operations

- a. A beautiful weather month lead to 5800 rounds in May
- b. Weekly member groups had a great turnout in May with over 1,500 member rounds.
- c. Range sales totaled \$5000 in May, with over 1500 users.
- d. Strong sales in the golf shop in May. Sales totaling \$19,500
- e. We hosted two large charity events in May. Events will pick up again in the fall.
- f. We hosted the Memorial Day Scramble in May. We had over 50 participants.
- g. We had a solid resident ACH account report with \$38,686 charged and only \$400 in returns so a great monthly report.

Clubhouse F&B

- a. Results for MAY again produced record level monthly sales .Mother's day brunch was a hit again, selling out, though we had a couple "no-shows" and last minute cancellations on the last seating.
- b. We conducted a successful event for the opening of the Dog Park. The event was well received by the residents, though we looked for a larger crowd, it went well and generated great feedback. We have completed the spring tournament season, though private events have continued to fill the calendar.
- c. Challenges continue with availability of food products, as well as higher costs. The shortages have not only affected food, but also products across the board, including alcohol, and non-food items.
- d. The new Beverage Cart continues to be held up in manufacturing, which will delay its arrival.
- e. Staffing issues remain in the kitchen. The front of house has stabilized with "summer" staff. The challenge will arise come August, as they return to school. They available staff will need to acclimate as they lack any real experience in the industry. We continue to address any issues with staff to secure our core team stays in position, and are addressing issues around compensation and quality of life, to keep any attrition to a minimum.

Golf Course Maintenance

- 1. A Bi-weekly verticutting program has been initiated
- 2. We continued our wetting agent program on greens to promote water infiltration and increase firmness
- 3. Weekly application of growth regulator was applied to suppress vertical growth, promote rooting, and increase lateral growth along with our weekly foliar fertilizer spray.
- 4. We began our full course mole cricket application to coordinate with the hatching of eggs, will be completed the first of June
- 5. Fairways were sprayed with an herbicide/ pre-emergent combination to combat summer weeds.
- 6. All lake banks were treated with an herbicide to combat weed pressure along with trimming weeds along banks
- 7. Seven pallets of sod were installed at weak areas along cart paths
- 8. Drainage was installed on 14 rough to combat standing water.
- 9. Tees were topdressed twice to help recovery from traffic
- 10. Driving range tees and all cart path edges were fertilized and spiked to relieve compaction and promote growth.

- 11. Tees were aerified using the Ventrac demo unit from Toro, this will help alleviate compaction issues from the amount of play we receive.
- 12. Preventative Maintenance was performed on the pump station
- 13. Only 1" of rain for the month, we are adding water daily along with a chemical penetrant as needed to combat dry areas.

Common Areas & Retention Ponds:

- 1. All lakes have been treated and inspected by the Lake Doctors. Written reports are submitted after each treatment. The Lake doctors continue to be responsive to our requests for additional treatments and adding dye where beneficial. They have continued extra treatments for the few troubled ponds.
- 2. Landscape and facility LED lighting replacements continue for all facilities.
- 3. The waterfall vault has not changed and the suction baskets will be back on schedule about every month to be cleaned.
- 4. Tree contractor has dropped dead trees in the wetland areas that posed a threat to property/life. The contractor also completed tree work on holes 11, 5 and 1.
- 5. Received 1st batch of county issued street name signs. New brackets received with powder coat issues in which we are working to resolve with supplier. 1st round of sign replacements focused on HT, OA, ED and SH.

Landscaping:

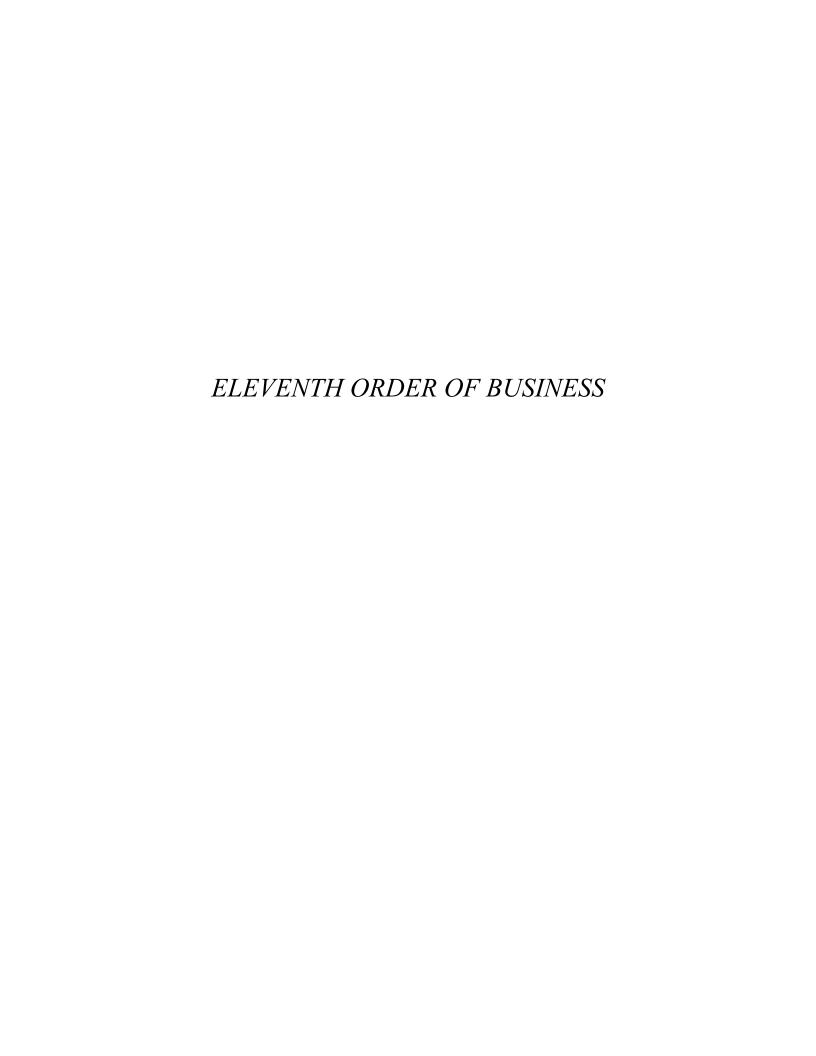
- 1. Director of Operations confers with Tree Amigos Landscape on a weekly basis. Grounds are being maintained per the contract.
- 2. Maintenance services provided to Eagle Landing by Tree Amigos May 1st May 31st
 - a. Ongoing maintenance per schedule for mowing and detail operations.
 - b. May irrigation inspection and repairs completed the week of 5/17/21. The irrigation system has been set to run everything 3 days a week and the flowers everyday. The rain sensors have been tested and are working correctly. The system is still setup as stated.
 - c. All Bermuda turf areas blanked treated for Mole Crickets with Triple Crown insecticide 5/18.
 - d. Palms in pool and clubhouse will be trimmed the 2nd week of June.
 - e. Hanging baskets on Parkway and planters at clubhouse, tennis and amenity center to be replanted in June.
 - f. Fertilizer application to be done 3rd week of June.
 - g. Flowers will be installed mid-June.

Misc:

- 1. Answered numerous phone calls, emails and visits from residents, contractors, vendors and other persons with inquiries. The subjects included, golf course maintenance, easement encroachments, alligators, lake maintenance, directions, repairs, drainage (both County and CDD owned), dead trees, vandalism, security, etc
 - 2. Facilities are inspected on a weekly basis
 - 3. The parks and playgrounds are inspected weekly and required repairs are made.
 - 4. Daily trash pickup along parkway, park sites and common areas.
